



When identifying a parcel it is important to specify the number of the plan on which it falls. Enclosure or *landed* is used for measurement of area.

Units of area within which individual parcels are measured are:

- convert hectares to acre multiply by 2.47105
- convert acres to acre multiply by 0.40469

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are 100 metre intervals. To give a unique reference defining the position of a point to within 10 metres, the following procedure should be followed:

1. Take the two letters preceding the sheet number
2. Take the west edge of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figure opposite the line on the east margin
3. Take the figure opposite the line on the east margin
4. Estimate tenths of metres from the grid line to the point (distance $\times 10$)
5. Estimate tenths of metres from the grid line to the point (distance $\times 10$)
6. Take the south edge of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the east margin
7. Estimate tenths of metres from the grid line to the point (distance $\times 10$)
8. The resulting four figures number the grid square and the tenths of metres
9. The resulting four figures number the grid square and the tenths of metres

For example, the grid reference for the meeting place of the Herringbone is

SD 058616
