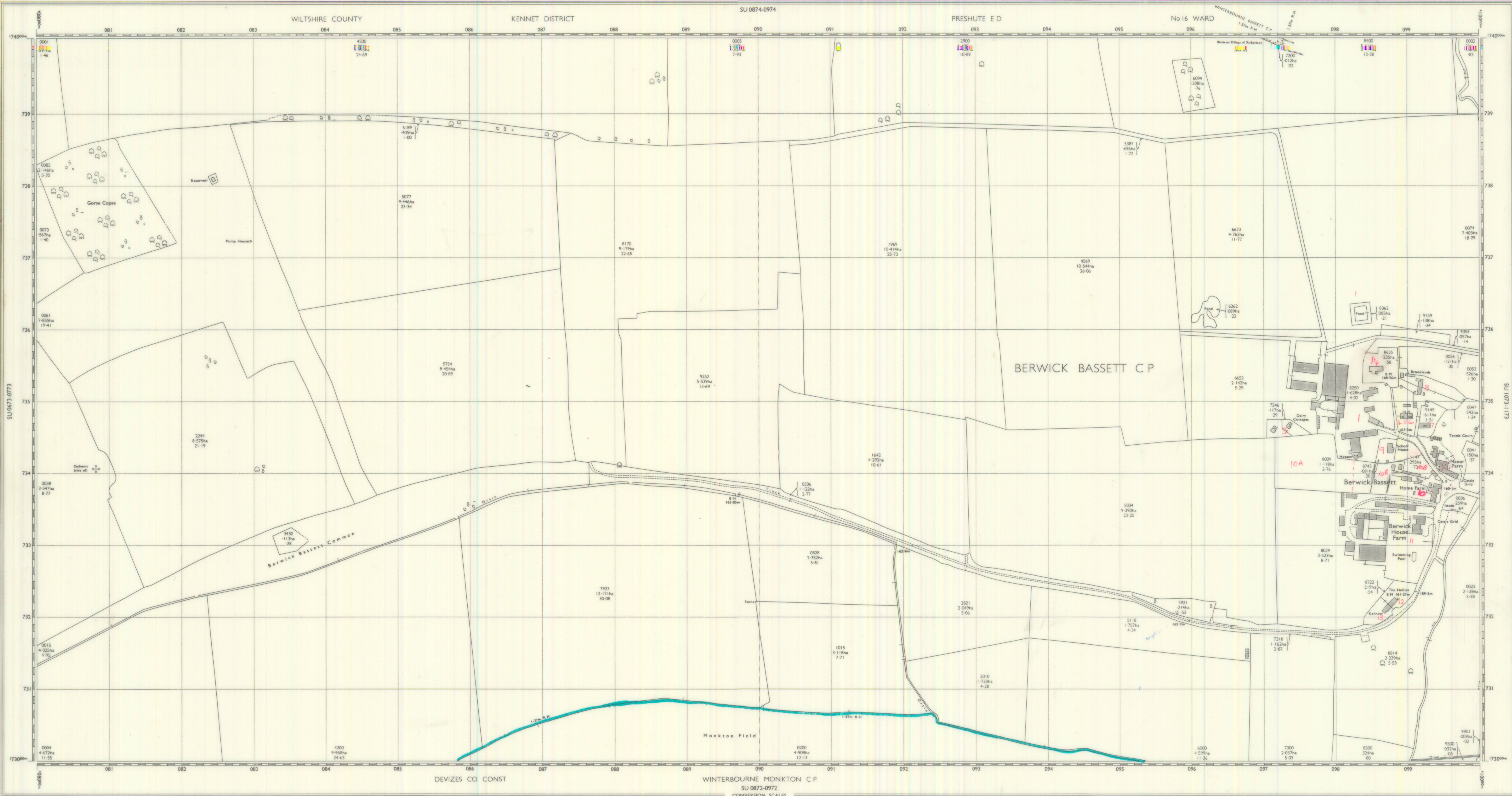

**NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE**

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a unique reference defining the position of a point to within 10 metres proceed as follows:

1. Take the two letters preceding the sheet number: TQ

2. Take the west edge of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the north or south margin: 058

3. Take the south edge of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the east or west margin: 291

4. The full four figure reference is given by writing first the letters, followed by the Easting and then the Northing: TQ 058 291
