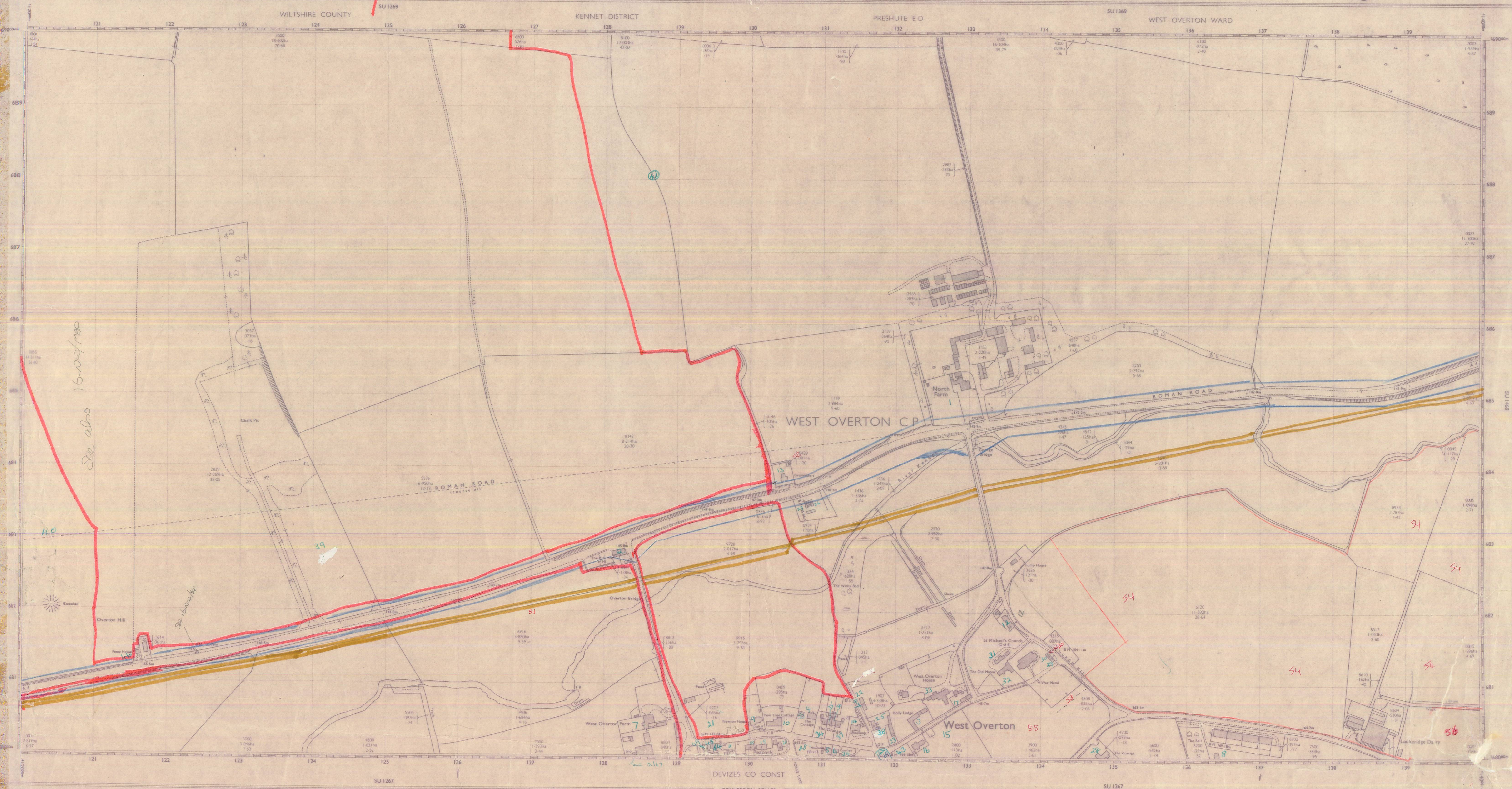

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a unique reference defining the position of a point to within 10 metres proceed as follows:

- Take the two letters preceding the sheet number.
- Take the west edge of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the east or west margin.
- Take the north edge of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the east or west margin.

The resulting four figure number is the National Grid Reference.
