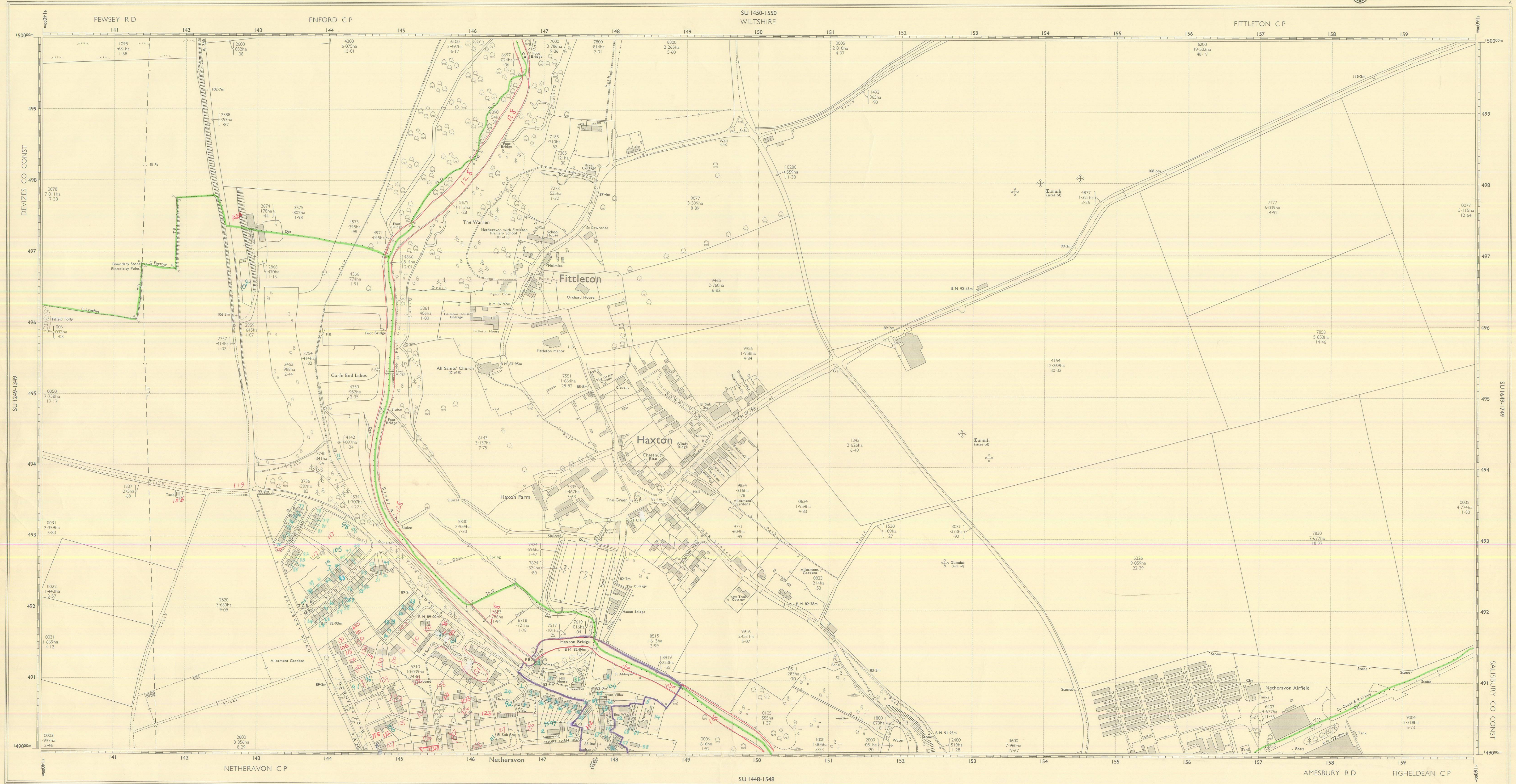

Where any boundary is usually coincident with civil parish boundaries and the symbols for both are shown, e.g. Rural County & Parish, but where only one boundary coincides with that of a civil parish the symbol for the latter only is shown, e.g. Parish or Rural County.

Imperial equivalents for metric boundary markings

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form parts of the national grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a reference defining the position of a point on a map to within 10 metres proceed as follows—

EXAMPLE:		F in Haxon Farm	
EASTING		NORTHING	
Take west edge of 100 metre square in which point lies and read the figures opposite this line on the north or south margin	146	Take south edge of 100 metres square in which point lies and read the figures opposite this line on the east or west margin	493
Estimate tens of metres from north to the point		Estimate tens of metres from north to the point	5
