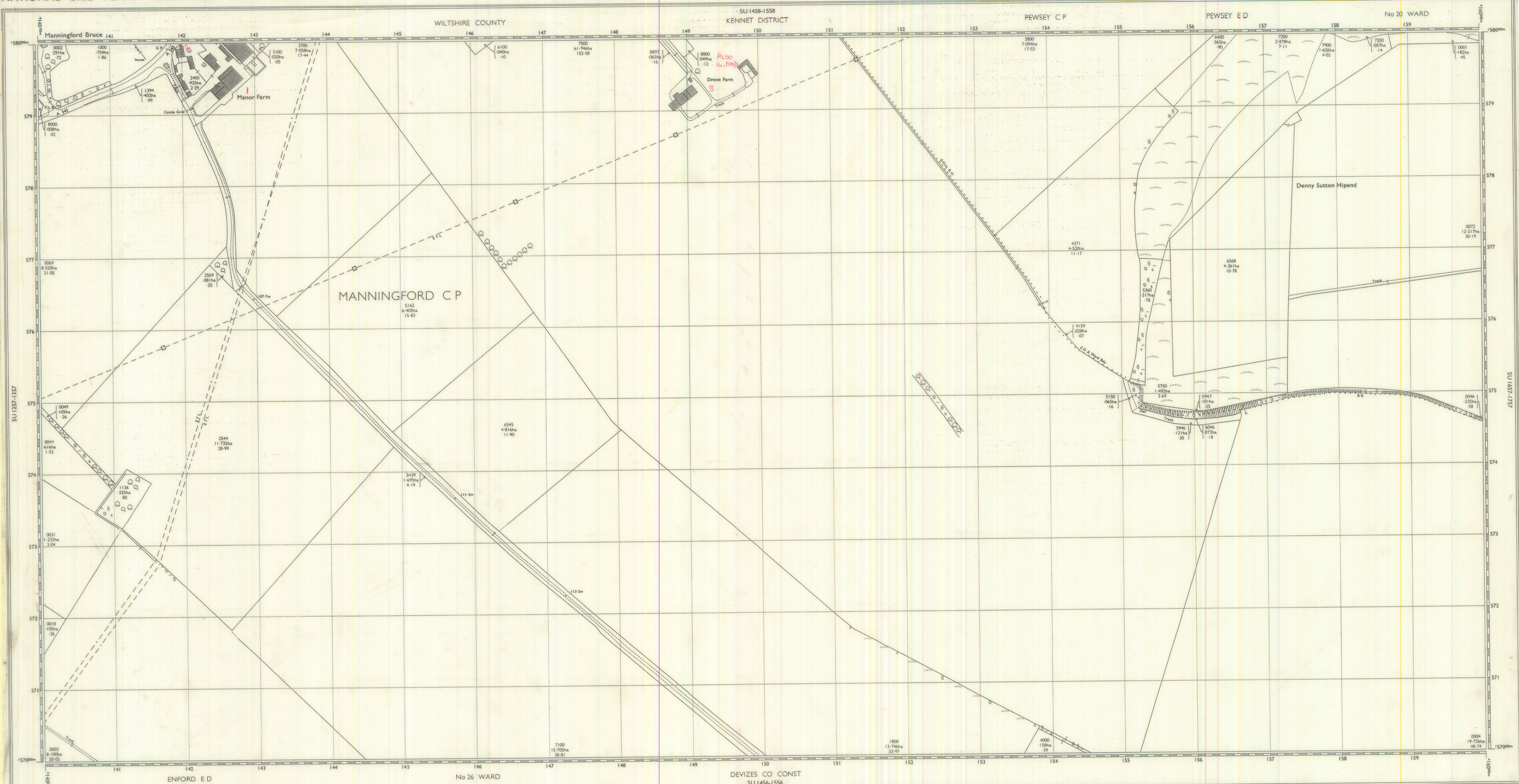

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and defining the position of a point to within 10 metres

1. Take the two letters preceding the sheet number
2. Take the west edge of the grid square in which you read the figures opposite this line on the north
3. Estimate tens of metres from the grid line to the resulting four figure number is the Easting
4. Take the south edge of the grid square in which you read the figures opposite this line on the east
5. Estimate tens of metres from the grid line to the resulting four figure number is the Northing
6. The full co-ordinate reference is given by westing followed by the Easting and then by the Northing
