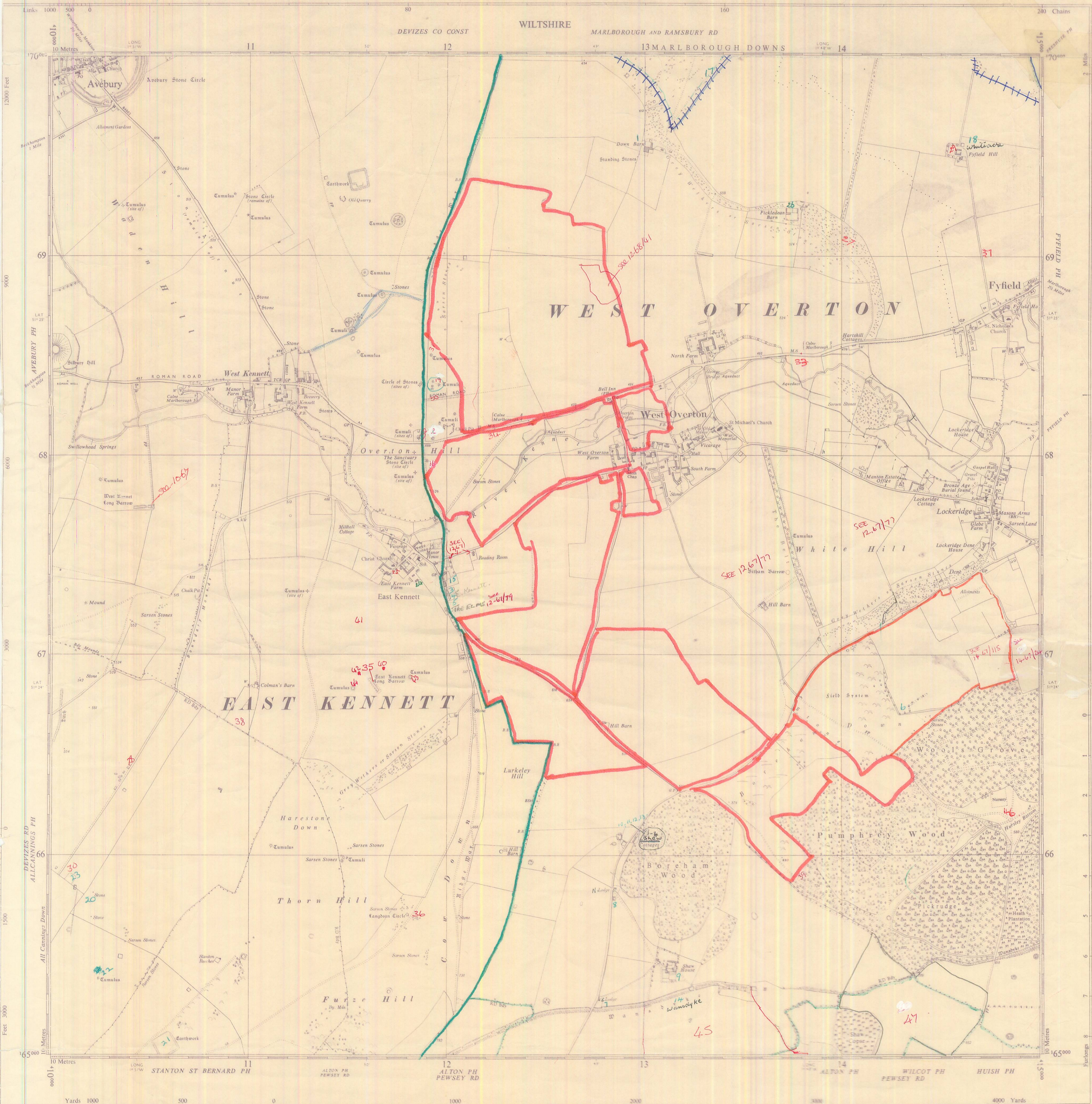

The above Full Reference is unique. For many purposes the first grid letter can be giving a reference, U 121675 which recurs at intervals of 500 Kilometres. If letters are omitted, the resulting reference 121675 recurs at intervals of 100 Kilometres. When the area concerned is sufficiently restricted, as will usually be the case, even on scales of one inch to the mile and larger, both the grid letters are normally

At the Eastern edge of this sheet True North is  $0^{\circ} 0'$  West of Grid North  
and at the Western edge  $0^{\circ} 07'$  West of Grid North  
Magnetic North was about  $9^{\circ}$  West of Grid North in 1961 decreasing by about  $\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$   
Heights are in feet above Mean Sea Level at Newlyn  
[square inch on this map represents 17.778 acres on the ground]
