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THE NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE SYSTEM

TO GIVE A GRID REFERENCE CORRECT TO 100 METRES

EXAMPLE Kimpton Mean

The grid letters on this sheet are SU

EASTING

The easting edge of the 100 metre square in which point lies and the 100 metre distance from the easting edge to the point.

Estimate tenths accurately.

NORTHING

The northing edge of the 100 metre square in which point lies and the 100 metre distance from the northing edge to the point.

Estimate tenths accurately.

Full 100 metre reference SU 274645

The 100 metre reference, above, is printed in grid letters on the map. The reading of the reference is restricted, as will be the case with maps on scales of one inch to one mile and larger, to the grid letters only.

At the eastern edge of this sheet North is 52° 00' West of Grid North and at the northern edge of this sheet North is 52° 00' West of Grid North.
