### NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

A grid line forms part of the National Grid and is at 100 metre intervals. To give a unique reference finding the position of a point to within 10 metres proceeds as follows:-

The full ten letter reference is given by writing first the Easting followed by the Northing and then the distance from the Easting and Northing lines.
