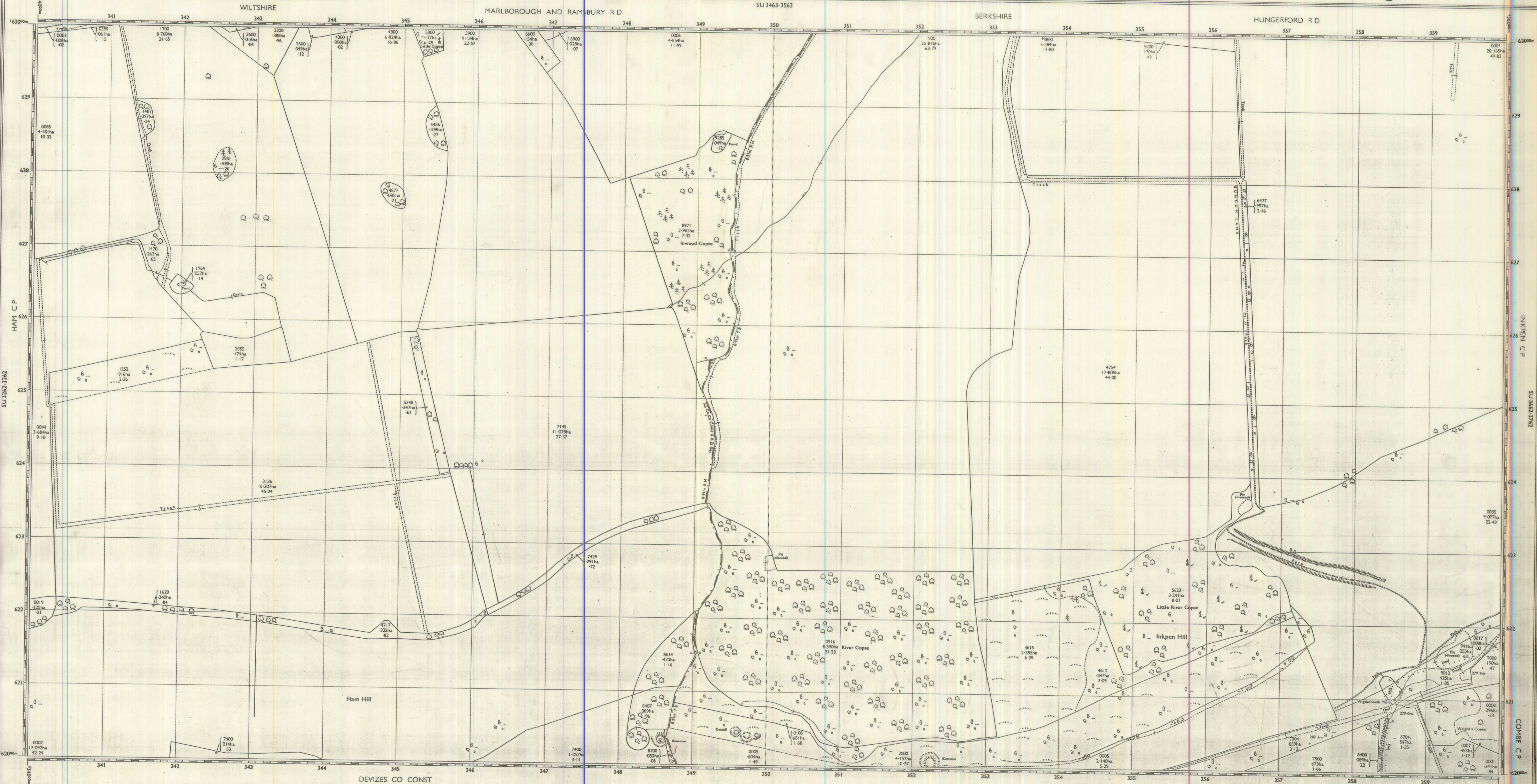

AREAS

Area measurement is to plus edge only.  
The number and area, in hectares (ha) and acres, is shown within each parcel of land.

EXAMPLE: 4267..... parcel number  
4.27..... area in hectares  
10.47..... area in acres

When identifying a parcel it is important to specify the number of the plan on which it falls.  
Enclosures or features joined for measurement of area are not shown.....  
Limit of area within which individual parcels are not shown.....  
To convert hectares to acres multiply by 2.471 05  
To convert acres to hectares multiply by 0.404 69

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the national grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a reference defining the position of a point to within 10 metres proceed as follows:-

EXAMPLE: 4267..... area in hectares  
4.27..... area in acres

EASTING

Take west edge of 100 metres square in which point lies and read the figures opposite this line on the east or west margin.  
Estimate tens of metres from grid line to the point.

NORTHING

Take south edge of 100 metres square in which point lies and read the figures opposite this line on the east or west margin.  
Estimate tens of metres from grid line to the point.
