2. Take the east edge of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figures opposite this line on the north or south margin. 058
3. Take the south edge of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figures opposite this line on the east or west margin. 291
4. The full ten metre reference is given by writing first the letters followed by the Easting and then by the Northing. TQ 058291
