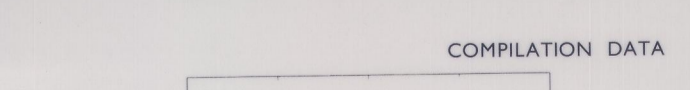

AREAS

Area measurement is to plan edge only.
 The number and area in hectares (ha) and acres, is shown within each parcel of land.

EXAMPLE: 4267 parcel number
 1.807ha area in hectares
 4.47 area in acres

When identifying a parcel it is important to specify the number of the plan on which it falls.
 Enclosures or features joined for measurement of area.....
 Limit of area within which individual parishes are not shown.....
 To convert hectares to acres multiply by 2.47105
 To convert acres to hectares multiply by 0.40469

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the national grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a reference defining the position of a point within 10 metres proceed as follows:
