B.B. Base of Bank, C.B. Centre of Bank, C.C.S. Centre of Covered Stream, C.D. Centre of Drain, etc.

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a reference defining the position of a point to within 10 metres proceed as follows:

EXAMPLE In Beaumont's Plantation

EASTINGS: Take the west edge of 100 metre square in which point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the east or south margin. Estimate tens of metres from grid line to the point.

NORTHINGS: Take the north edge of 100 metre square in which point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the east or south margin. Estimate tens of metres from grid line to the point.
