NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The lines on this plan form part of the National Grid and are spaced at 100 metre intervals. To give a large scale reference, once the position of a point to the nearest 10 metres proceed as follows—

EXAMPLE: L in Lower Barford Farm

EASTING	NORTHING
Take west edge of square to which point lies and read the figures opposite this line on NORTH and SOUTH margins	Take south edge of square to which point lies and read the figures opposite this line on EAST and WEST margins
Estimate tenths of metres from the grid line	Estimate tenths of metres from the grid line
