CONVERSION SCALES: METRES-ACRES, METRES-FEET. 1 hectare = 2.471 acres, 1 metre = 3.2808 feet, 1 foot = 0.3048 metres.

AREAS: Area measurements in hectares (ha) and acres. Example: 4.267 ha = 10.527 acres.

BOUNDARIES: ENGLAND & WALES, SCOTLAND, London Borough, Civil Parish (England), Community (Wales), Electoral Division, Ward, Constituency (County, Borough or European Assembly), Boro Const Bdy, Euro Const Bdy, Boro Const & E D Bdy.

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE: The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a unique reference defining the position of a point to within 10 metres proceed as follows: EXAMPLE from sheet TQ 0529: TQ 298, 292, 058, 058.

SYMBOLS: Non-coniferous trees, Coniferous trees, Surveyed trees, Orchard trees, Coppice, scrub, Roofed building, Glasshouse, Archway, Change of boundary marking, see AREAS notes, Slopes, Cliff, Cave entrance, Rock, Stopping masonry, Roofed building, Archway, Site of antiquity, Culvert, Direction of water flow, Pylon, Electricity Transmission Line, Triangulation station, Traverse station (permanent), Bench mark, Surface level, Revision point, Revision point & bench mark coincident.
