NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE: The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a unique reference, the position of a point is shown by a four-figure grid reference.

EXAMPLE: TQ 0529 2928. The first two letters (TQ) are the sheet number. The next two (0529) are the easting. The last two (2928) are the northing.

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
