WHEREAS

- 1. It appears to the North Wiltshire District Council ("the Council") being the local planning authority for the purposes of Section 172 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 ("the Act") in this matter, that there has been a breach of planning control, under Section 171A(1)(a), within the last ten years on the land or premises ("the land") described in Schedule 1 below.
- 2. The breach of planning control which appears to have taken place consists in the carrying out of development by the making of the material change in the use of the land described in Schedule 2 overleaf without the grant of planning permission required for that development.
- 3. The Council consider it expedient, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to all other material considerations, to issue this enforcement notice, in exercise of their powers in the said Section 172 for the reasons set out in this notice.

Schedule 1 - The Site to which this Notice relates

Land at Leigh Delamere Motorway Service Area, Chippenham, Wiltshire shown edged red on the attached plan ("the Land").

Schedule 2 - The Contravention

Without planning permission, change of use of the Land from use as a motorway service area to a use for that purpose and for the storage, collection, repair and distribution of timber pallets.


Schedule 3 - Steps required to be taken

- 1. Cease the use of the Land for any purpose connected with the collection, storage, repair or distribution of timber pallets.
- 2. Remove all pallets and all vehicles, trailers, plant, machinery, equipment and any other item associated with the use without planning permission and leave the site in a neat and tidy condition.

Reasons for issuing this Notice

- 1. The development is not a service provided for motorway users and is likely to generate specific journeys along a motorway, which is not in the interests of other users of the highway, (as advised by the Highways Agency).
- 2. The development is likely to generate movements of traffic between the M4 and the local road network (Kington St Michael Leigh Delamere Road) via the rear service roads to the respective east-bound and west-bound service areas and such unauthorised movements would constitute a hazard to road users which would not be in the interests of road safety.
- 3. It is considered that at peak times the demand for parking spaces within the service areas matches the supply of spaces, and loss of spaces to the collection/storage of pallets would be prejudicial to efficient operation of the service area and not in the interests of road safety.
- The development cannot be demonstrated to be essential at this location and is an unacceptable addition to the visual clutter caused by the provision of essential services to motorway users which could lead to pressure for other similar development within the site, to the detriment of visual amenity in an attractive rural area.
