The unauthorised use of the land, together with associated activities and facilities, in a prominent position adjacent to a listed building, adversely affects the setting of the listed building, contrary to Policies B4 and B5 of the North Wiltshire Local Plan, as endorsed by Policy RB10 of the North Wiltshire Local Plan Review, which seek to protect listed buildings from harmful development in their vicinity.
