ENFORCEMENT NOTICE

ISSUED BY: North Wiltshire District Council

1. **THIS NOTICE** is issued by the Council because it appears to them that there has been a breach of planning control, within paragraph (a) of section 171A(1) of the above Act, at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations. The Annex at the end of the notice and the enclosures to which it refers contain important additional information.

2. **THE LAND TO WHICH THE NOTICE RELATES**

Land at Barretts Yard, 29A Stone Lane, Lydiard Millicent, Wiltshire ("the Land")

3. **THE MATTERS WHICH APPEAR TO CONSTITUTE THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL**

Without planning permission, change of use of the Land from use as builder's yard to use for the storage and sorting of scrap material.

4. **REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE**

It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last ten years. The unauthorised use of the site for the storage of scrap and associated activity is considered to introduce an intrusive commercial element detrimental to the rural amenities of the area, thereby adversely affecting the character of the countryside. This is contrary to the provisions of Policy C7 of the North Wiltshire Local Plan and Policy RC9 of the North Wiltshire Local Plan Review which seeks, inter alia, to ensure development has a minimal impact on the open landscape and does not affect the amenities and rural character of the area.

5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

- a) Cease the use of the Land for the storage and sorting of scrap materials and waste.
- b) Remove such scrap materials and waste from the land, together with associated facilities including any skips used for storage.

6. TIME FOR COMPLIANCE

Three months after this Notice takes effect.

7. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This notice takes effect on 1st June 1999 unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.




