3. THE MATTERS WHICH APPEAR TO CONSTITUTE THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL

Without planning permission, change of use from domestic garage/workshop, hardstanding and open land to use for storage/distribution and as an office.

4. REASON FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last ten years. Retention of the unauthorised use, the scale and extent of which are difficult to control, would harm the deeply rural character of the area and the residential amenity of adjoining residential property, contrary to Policy E16 of the North Wiltshire Local Plan and Policy RE20 of the North Wiltshire Local Plan Review.




