- a) It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last ten years.
- b) The siting of a residential caravan creates a new unit of residential accommodation which cannot be shown to be necessary at this location and constitutes an undesirable form of ribbon development at a prominent location along a classified road outside the settlement framework of Christian Malford. The development is therefore contrary to Policies H13 and C7 of the North

Wiltshire Local Plan as endorsed and amended by Policies RH16 and RC9 of the North Wiltshire Local Plan Review.

- c) The Council considers that access to the site from the public highway (B4069) is affected by substandard visibility, on a section of the B4069 where forward visibility along the carriageway is also restricted, and that the additional movements of turning traffic associated with the unauthorised use exacerbates an existing hazard to road users, contrary to the interests of highway safety.
- d) The development lies within an area at risk from flooding from the River Avon and the development reduces both the flood flow conveyance and the flood water storage capacity of the flood plan, increasing the likelihood of flooding elsewhere and does not therefore accord with the provisions of DoE Circular 30/92 and policy RH16 of the emerging North Wiltshire Local Plan Review which discourages the siting of caravans within flood plan areas.

- d) Remove from the land all vehicles and storage units associated with the unauthorised use.
