1. THIS NOTICE is issued by the Council because it appears to them that there has been a breach of planning control, within paragraph (a) of section 171A(1) of the above Act, at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations. The Annex at the end of the notice and the enclosures to which it refers contain important additional information.

2. THE LAND TO WHICH THE NOTICE RELATES

Land at The Old Spotted Cow, The Street, Marston Meysey, Wiltshire shown hatched on the attached plan ("the Land")

3. THE MATTERS WHICH APPEAR TO CONSTITUTE THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL

Without planning permission, change of use of the Land from a mixed use for purposes ancillary to the Public House and agriculture to a use for the stationing of touring and residential caravans.

4. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

- It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last 10 years.
- b) The change of use of the Land involves the introduction of a visually prominent and alien feature detrimental to both the character and appearance of the designated Conservation Area and the village's rural setting. The development fails to accord with the relevant policies of the Adopted North Wiltshire Local Plan Review namely Policies RB3 and RC10.

c) The development is not essential to agricultural or forestry operations, or for other purposes connected with maintaining the rural economy. The development does not accord with Policies RH16 and RC10 of the Adopted North Wiltshire Local Plan Review.

5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

- a) Cease the use of the Land for the stationing of touring and residential caravans.
- b) Remove all touring caravans and residential caravans from the Land, together with all soil pipe connections, all jacks, plinths or other supports for the caravans.
- c) Remove all domestic items stored or stationed on the Land, in association with the caravans, including sheds, washing lines and television aerials.

6. TIME FOR COMPLIANCE

One month from the date on which this notice takes effect.

7. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This notice takes effect on 27 February 2003 unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.


YOUR RIGHT OF APPEAL

- (a) One is for you to send to the Secretary of State if you decide to appeal, together with a copy of this enforcement notice.
- (b) The second copy of the appeal form should be sent to the Council.
- (c) The third copy is for your own records.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU DO NOT APPEAL

If you do not appeal against this enforcement notice, it will take effect on the date specified in paragraph 7 of the notice and you must then ensure that the required steps for complying with it, for which you may be held responsible, are taken within the period specified in paragraph 6 of the notice. Failure to comply with an enforcement notice which has taken effect can result in prosecution and/or remedial action by the Council.

Land at The Old Spotted Cow, The Street, Marston Meysey, Wiltshire, shown hatched on the attached plan ("the Land")

3. THE MATTERS WHICH APPEAR TO CONSTITUTE THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL

Without planning permission, carrying out unauthorised engineering works on the Land comprising the laying of a new gravelled hardstanding.

4. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

- a) It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last 4 years.
- b) The development is uncharacteristic of the prevailing rural scene and specifically detracts from the character and appearance of the designated Conservation Area. The development is contrary to both Policies RB3 and RC10 of the Adopted North Wiltshire Local Plan Review.

5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

- a) Remove the gravel/hardcore placed on the site to reveal the natural ground.
- b) Cover the revealed ground with a minimum depth of 300mm of soil.
- c) Seed the disturbed areas of land using an agricultural grass seed mixture supplied by an approved agricultural seed merchant.

6. TIME FOR COMPLIANCE

Six months from the date on which this notice takes effect.

7. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This notice takes effect on 27 February 2003 unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.
