ENFORCEMENT NOTICE

ISSUED BY: North Wiltshire District Council

1. THIS NOTICE is issued by the Council because it appears to them that there has been a breach of planning control, within paragraph (a) of section 171A(1) of the above Act, at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations. The Annex at the end of the notice and the enclosures to which it refers contain important additional information.

2. THE LAND TO WHICH THE NOTICE RELATES

Land at 4 New Road Purton, Swindon, Wiltshire SN5 9HF shown hatched on the attached plan.

3. THE MATTERS WHICH APPEAR TO CONSTITUTE THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL

Without planning permission, the erection of a 2 metre high fence

4. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

- a) It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last four years.
- b) The 2 metre high fence produces a discordant feature in the street scene spoiling the open character of the area to the detriment of visual amenity and if allowed to remain would create an unfortunate precedent for similar unsatisfactory development elsewhere.

5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

- a) Remove the fence or reduce the height of the fence to 1 metre above ground level.
- b) Remove all debris resulting from the removal or the reduction of the height of the fence from the land.

6. TIME FOR COMPLIANCE

Two months from the time the notice takes effect.

7. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This notice takes effect on 16 January 2004 unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.

ANNEX

YOUR RIGHT OF APPEAL

You can appeal against this notice, but any appeal must be received, or posted in time to be **received**, by the First Secretary of State **before** the date specified in paragraph 7 of the notice. The enclosed booklet "Making your enforcement appeal" sets out your rights. The enclosed appeal forms are for your use.

- (a) One is for you to send to the Secretary of State if you decide to appeal, together with a copy of this enforcement notice.
- (b) The second copy of the appeal form should be sent to the Council.
- (c) The third copy is for your own records.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU DO NOT APPEAL

If you do not appeal against this enforcement notice, it will take effect on the date specified in paragraph 7 of the notice and you must then ensure that the required steps for complying with it, for which you may be held responsible, are taken within the period specified in paragraph 6 of the notice. Failure to comply with an enforcement notice which has taken effect can result in prosecution and/or remedial action by the Council.
