ENFORCEMENT NOTICE

ISSUED BY: North Wiltshire District Council

1. THIS NOTICE is issued by the Council because it appears to them that there has been a breach of planning control, within paragraph (a) of section 171A(1) of the above Act, at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations. The Annex at the end of the notice and the enclosures to which it refers contain important additional information.

2. THE LAND TO WHICH THE NOTICE RELATES

Land at Old Weaver's Cottage and Weaver's Cottage, Slaughterford, Chippenham, Wiltshire shown hatched on the attached plan.

3. THE MATTERS WHICH APPEAR TO CONSTITUTE THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL

Without planning permission, the erection of a fence in the position shown by the thick black line between Old Weaver's Cottage and Weaver's Cottage, Slaughterford, on the attached plan.

4. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

- a) It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last four years.
- b) The fence, in the position erected, significantly detracts from the character of the adjacent listed buildings and their settings. It is particularly detrimental to the building known as the Wellhead as the fence goes through this historic building. The development is therefore contrary to policy RB10 of the North Wiltshire Local Plan 2001.

5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

- a) Dismantle and remove the fence.
- b) Remove the debris resulting from dismantling the fence from the land

6. TIME FOR COMPLIANCE

Two months from the date the notice takes effect.

7. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This notice takes effect on 23 January 2004 unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.

ANNEX

YOUR RIGHT OF APPEAL

You can appeal against this notice, but any appeal must be received, or posted in time to be **received**, by the First Secretary of State **before** the date specified in paragraph 7 of the notice. The enclosed booklet "Making your enforcement appeal" sets out your rights. The enclosed appeal forms are for your use.

- (a) One is for you to send to the Secretary of State if you decide to appeal, together with a copy of this enforcement notice.
- (b) The second copy of the appeal form should be sent to the Council.
- (c) The third copy is for your own records.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU DO NOT APPEAL

If you do not appeal against this enforcement notice, it will take effect on the date specified in paragraph 7 of the notice and you must then ensure that the required steps for complying with it, for which you may be held responsible, are taken within the period specified in paragraph 6 of the notice. Failure to comply with an enforcement notice which has taken effect can result in prosecution and/or remedial action by the Council.
