ENFORCEMENT NOTICE

ISSUED BY: North Wiltshire District Council

1. THIS NOTICE is issued by the Council because it appears to them that there has been a breach of planning control, within paragraph (a) of section 171A(1) of the above Act, at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations. The Annex at the end of the notice and the enclosures to which it refers contain important additional information.

2. THE LAND TO WHICH THE NOTICE RELATES

Land at Marsh End Farm, The Common, Heddington, Calne, Wiltshire shown hatched on the attached plan.

3. THE MATTERS WHICH APPEAR TO CONSTITUTE THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL

Without planning permission, the material change of use of the land by the stationing of a caravan on the land for residential purposes.

4. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

- It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last ten years.
- b) The use of the caravan for residential purposes constitutes the provision of dwelling accommodation in the countryside where residential development is strictly controlled. The continued siting and use of the caravan for residential purposes is contrary to Policy RH11 of the North Wiltshire Local Plan 2001 and Policy DP15 of the Wiltshire Structure Plan 2011.

- c) The siting of the caravan in this countryside location is detrimental to the rural character and amenity of the area contrary to Policy RC9 of the North Wiltshire Local Plan 2001.
- d) The continued use of this land for the siting of the caravan and its residential use would, in due course, lead to the unauthorised development being lawful. The loss of planning control over the use of this site for the siting of a residential caravan would be likely to lead to further adverse visual detriment to the rural character of the area and the possible redevelopment of the site by the erection of a permanent building for residential purposes.

5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

- a) Remove the unauthorised caravan from the site.
- b) Remove all debris resulting from the removal of the caravan, and all associated domestic accourtements, equipment, chattels and other such paraphernalia from the land.

6. TIME FOR COMPLIANCE

Four months from the date this notice takes effect.

7. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This notice takes effect on 4 February 2004 unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.

ANNEX

YOUR RIGHT OF APPEAL

You can appeal against this notice, but any appeal must be received, or posted in time to be **received**, by the First Secretary of State **before** the date specified in paragraph 7 of the notice. The enclosed booklet "Making your enforcement appeal" sets out your rights. The enclosed appeal forms are for your use.

- (a) One is for you to send to the Secretary of State if you decide to appeal, together with a copy of this enforcement notice.
- (b) The second copy of the appeal form should be sent to the Council.
- (c) The third copy is for your own records.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU DO NOT APPEAL

If you do not appeal against this enforcement notice, it will take effect on the date specified in paragraph 7 of the notice and you must then ensure that the required steps for complying with it, for which you may be held responsible, are taken within the period specified in paragraph 6 of the notice. Failure to comply with an enforcement notice which has taken effect can result in prosecution and/or remedial action by the Council.
