

REQUIREMENTS of ENFORCEMENTSteps required to be taken

To remove or secure the removal of the five solar heating panels installed in the roof and reinstate the stone slates, using in the case of any missing or damaged slates, other slates similar in appearance to the existing slates.

WHEREAS:

- (1) It appears to the North Wiltshire District Council ("the Council") being the local planning authority for the purposes of Section 96 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 ("the Act") in this matter, that there has been a breach of planning control on the premises (hereinafter called "the premises") described in Schedule 1 below.
- (2) The breach of planning control which appears to have taken place consists in the execution of works described in Schedule 2 below to a Listed building affecting its character as a building of Special Architectural and Historic Interest, without the grant of Listed Building Consent required for that development in contravention of Section 55(1) of the Act.
- (3) The Council consider it expedient, having regard to the effects of the works on the character of the building as one of Special Architectural and Historic Interest, to issue this Listed Building Enforcement Notice in exercise of their powers contained in the said Section 96 of the Act for the reasons set out in the annex hereto.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council require that the steps specified in Schedule 3 below be taken in order to restore the building to its former state within the period of six months from the date on which this notice takes effect.

THIS NOTICE SHALL TAKE EFFECT, subject to the provisions of section 97(9) of the Act, on 21st February, 1983.



Statement of Reasons

1. The installation of five solar panels in a prominent position on this Cotswold stone Grade II listed building is severely detrimental to its architectural character, visual appearance and historic setting
2. The development, if allowed, would set a precedent for similar installations on buildings of historic and architectural merit throughout the area which is one designated as an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.
