AREAS

Area measurement is to plan only.

The number and area, in hectares (ha) and acres, is shown within each parcel of land.

EXAMPLE: 4267.....parcel number

1.807ha.....area in hectares

4.47.....area in acres

When identifying a parcel it is important to specify the number of the plan on which it falls.

To convert hectares to acres multiply by 2.47105.

To convert acres to hectares multiply by 0.40469.

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give the position of a point in the grid, the grid square reference is given.

The grid square reference is given by writing first the letters, followed by the figures of the grid square, and then by the Northing.

The resulting four figure number is the Northing.

The four figure number reference is given by writing first the letters, followed by the figures of the grid square, and then by the Northing.
